In 2013, I taught two different classes at Philadelphia University - **Digital Experience Design** and **Introduction to Front End Development**. Teaching was a blast and it forced me to really learn and fine tune how I talk about each topic. For the Experience Design class, I developed the curriculum around improving a SaaS product (voted on by the class). By the end of the semester, I had each student conducting research, thinking through interaction design, validating their ideas with prototypes, and coding out a rough version of the final result. Then we had a big demo day for the project "stakeholders" where each team demoed their portion of the product and talks through design decisions made.

With a background in interface design, I have a track record of designing and shipping multiple successful products over the years.



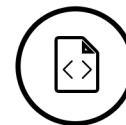
#### Requirements Gathering

I've worked with a team to map out why / how a customer uses our product to better understand their motivations / expectations.



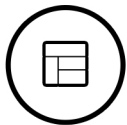
#### Development Chops

I'm proficient enough in HTML/CSS/Javascript to build prototypes when a solution is not cookie-cutter and standard prototyping software falls short.



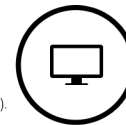
#### Benchmarking / Usage Analysis
